ORDINANCE NO. 10-06-03

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE OPERATION OF ANY VEHICLE IN AN EASTERLY DIRECTION ON MAIN STREET AS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 1; PROVIDING FOR THE ERECTION OF UPRIGHT SIGNS AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 2; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY.

SECTION 1

From and after the publication of this ordinance and the erection of the signs described in Section 2 hereof, it shall be unlawful to drive any vehicle in an easterly direction on Main Street within the following area:

Beginning where the Northeast right of way of Main Street intersects with the South right of way line of State Highway 155;

Thence along the East right of way of Main Street to the Northwest corner of Main Street at the South intersection of Commerce;

Thence in a southerly direction on Commerce Street to the Southwest intersection of Main Street;

Thence in an easterly direction to the Southeast right of way of Main Street to the South right of way of State Highway 155;

Thence North along the Southeast right of way of Main Street to the point of beginning.

SECTION 2

The City Street Superintendent or his equivalent shall erect not less than four (4) signs. Two (2) signs "One Way Street" at the Southwest corner of Main Street and the South right of way line of State Highway 155, secondly at the Northeast corner of Main Street and the South right of way line of State Highway 155.

The following signs "Do Not Enter" to be located at the Northwest intersection of Main Street and the South right of way of Commerce Street, secondly at the Southwest right of way of Main Street and the South right of way of State Highway 155.

SECTION 3

Any person who shall violate the provisions of Section 1 of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction fined not less than \$1.00 and not more than the maximum fine permitted by law.

SECTION 4

It being deemed by the City Council that this ordinance shall go into immediate effect and force after its passage, approval, and publication according to law.
