GARBAGE BURNING ORDINANCE

03/1/91

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FRANKSTON, TEXAS MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON, FIRM, OR CORPORATION TO BURN ANY HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE, WASTE FOOD, FECES, PLASTIC PRODUCTS OR ANY TOXIC PRODUCT AS A MEANS OF DISPOSAL WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF FRANKSTON, TEXAS AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE ORDINANCE BY ANY PERSON, FIRM, OR CORPORATIONS AND, UPON CONVICTION, SUCH PERSON, FIRM OR CORPORATION SHALL BE FINED NOT MORE THAN TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200.00).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FRANKSTON, TEXAS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1.

That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to burn any household garbage, waste food, feces, plastic products, or any toxic products within the city limits of Frankston, Texas.

Section 2.

Whenever it shall become necessary for any person, firm or corporation to have a fire out of doors for cooking, washing or any other purely domestic purposes, such person, firm, or corporation is hereby required to build such in a fire proof container in such a manner as to prevent such fire from escaping.

Section 3.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to ignite any fire in or on any street, alley or thoroughfare of the City of Frankston, Texas.

Section 4.


Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any of the provisions of this article shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined in any sum not exceeding TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200.00), and each and every day's violation shall constitute a separate and distinct offense.

Section 5.

If any article, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, or provision of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or be held unconstitutional, the same shall not effect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any part of the provision thereof, other than the part so decided to be invalid or held to be unconstitutional.
