- 1. That any and all ordinances or parts of ordinances relating to speed zones on S.H. 155 between 150' south of Caddo Creek bridge, north to the existing 40 mile per hour speed zone in the city of Frankston, Texas are hereby temporarily revised to 45 miles per hour. Upon completion of Texas Department of Transportation Project STP 2001(35)RM and acceptance by the State, the speed zone shall revert to those ordained by the city's ordinance indicated.
- 2. Whereas the preservation of the general welfare of the public necessitates this action, this ordinance shall be effective from the start of construction of TxDOT Project STP 2001(35)RM in Anderson County to its completetion and acceptance by the State.

The Texas Department of Transportation has completed construction plans for the widening of SH 155 from the Henderson County Line, south to FM 19. After reviewing the construction phasing, it has been determined that a temporary work zone speed limit of 45 mph is required. This work zone speed limit would extend from the south end of Caddo Creek bridge north to the existing 40 mph zone and help to ensure the safety of the traveling public and workmen during the construction of SH 155.
